



Who can be a delegate?

Article XI, Section 1 of NAHU's bylaws states:

“The House of Delegates shall consist of:

- A. The Board of Trustees
- B. Past Presidents of NAHU
- C. Delegates of state and local associations as designated in Sections 2 and 3 of this ARTICLE.”

To be eligible to be a chapter delegate, the person must be an active member in good standing of the chapter he or she is representing. For example, a delegate for Greater Washington AHU must have all dues paid through June 30, of the current year, for Greater Washington AHU, Maryland AHU and NAHU.

Past state presidents in good standing may be appointed as a delegate for any local chapter in the state of which he or she presided regardless of his or her local membership.

Past NAHU presidents and **current Board of Trustee members** are not eligible to be state or local chapter delegates; they are already delegates as detailed in NAHU's bylaws, Article XI, Section 1.
